Potential Honours project list

- Is there an optimal camera-trap survey? Using high-resolution GPS-collar data to optimize surveys for African large carnivores.
- Activity of African large carnivores in a livestock-dominated environment.
- Making a sustained killing: do pest eradication products promote ineffective control?
- Feeding ferals: monitoring and managing feral species access to supplementary food in a zoo or farm environment.
- Platypus stress: evaluation of the effects of river flow regimes on platypus glucocorticoids.
- Ecological determinants and impacts of den/lair-site selection in African large carnivores (African wild dogs, cheetah, lions).
- Scent-marking strategies and movement ecology of African wild dogs.
